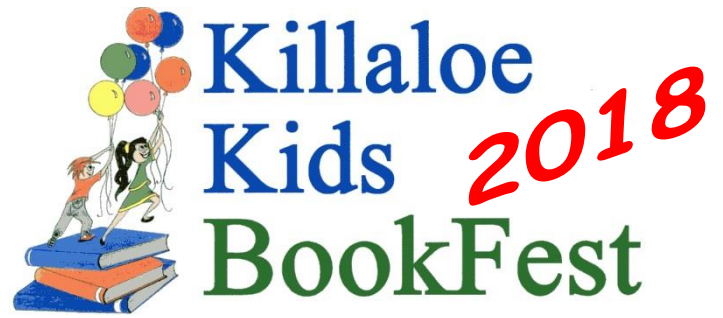

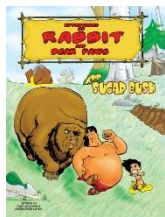


Adventures of Rabbit and Bear Paws

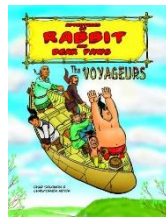

This series of graphic novels portray two mischievous boys and the trouble they get in and out of as they try to do everything their way. Many personal and social lessons for youth are illustrated.

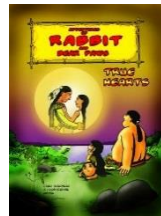

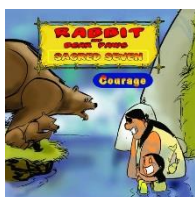
Rabbit and Bear Paws: The Sacred Seven

Presentations are comical, educational, and highly interactive with the use of puppets. Children are invited to play various roles.
